Budget Report

Lisa reported that the budget is in good shape, with \$10,766 in available funds (minus the \$3,753 in the restricted scholarship account). Major recent outlays include \$631 for Movie Night and \$423 for Teacher Appreciation Week. Concession sales are likely to recoup the cost for Movie Night. Teacher Appreciation was budgeted for \$850, so it was well under budget. The Spring Dance also brought in more than expected, with a profit of \$592. Discussion on Renovation

Despite being ranked as the school 3rd most worthy of renovation by the Education Committee of the DC Council, no action was taken by the Education Committee or the Council to move West renovation earlier. Therefore, the mayor's proposal to start design in FY19 and construction in FY20 and FY21 looks like it will stand. Several parents are still working with our newly elected Councilmember, Brandon Todd, to help improve the situation. No path forward has been identified yet.

Principal Selection Process

DCPS has a process for giving parents, staff, and the community an opportunity to be part of the principal selection process. A meeting was held on May 14 to elect three parents, four staff

members, and two community members and alternates who will interview three principal candidates on June 2. DCPS selects a few candidates—who have already been through an interview process. The panel sets questions in advance and ranks the candidates. We hope for a reasonably fast resolution.
