- We had our modernization meeting last Monday and learned that the PSCO/LSAT should recommend families for the SIT committee.
- Potential schools to visit are Marie Reed and Orr to see open space concepts after modernization.
- This year a feasibility study will determine if we get brand new construction vs. gutting the current structure.
